ADVISORY GROUP MEETING INFO.

MARCH MEETING

The Advisory Group will meet on March 16 at 6:30 PM at the DASH Facility (3000 Business Center Drive) and via Zoom (https://zoom.us/webinar/register/WN_mXAnVFaXSxO1qzc8GocJWw). The Advisory Group will be reviewing design updates since December, a template for their recommendation to Council (which will be discussed in May), and the engagement plan for the duration of this conceptual design phase of the project. FEBRUARY MEETING RECAP

On February 16, the Advisory Group discussed details about curb features. In this process, "curb features" are defined as elements over the curb, which may include bicycle facilities, green space, pedestrian facilities, and service roads.

The Project Team's proposal for curb features focused on improvements to the north side of the street, continuous facilities for walking and biking. In some sections without right of way constraints, this took the form of a separated two-way cycle track and a wider sidewalk. In more constrained environments, it included a shared use path. Where feasible, additional green space was introduced.

There was broad Advisory Group consensus that safety should be a top priority in the design of curb features. There was consensus, though not unanimity, that a continuous bicycle facility should also be deemed a priority and that a bicycle facility separated from pedestrians should be accommodated to the extent possible. Several members spoke to the importance of green space, but not to the detriment of safety for all users.

PROJECT UPDATES

COUNCIL PRESENTATION & OTHER MEETINGS

Project Team staff **presented to Council** at the February 14th Legislative Meeting to provide an update about the project and next steps. While the analysis of the design concepts will not be completed until April, the Project Team has been visiting businesses and meeting with civic associations and homeowners' associations to provide information about the project and receive feedback. In early March, members of the Project Team presented to an Alexandria City High School class about transportation planning and Duke Street in Motion. 
